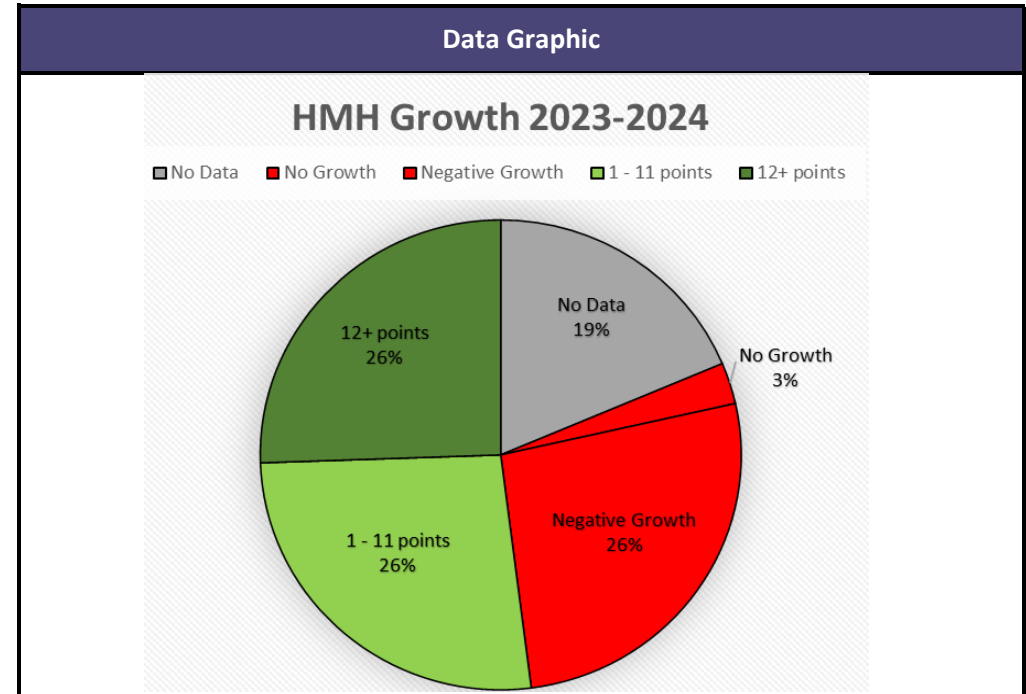

We met our school wide goal of 22% of student will make 12 points of growth or more from beginning of year to end of year on the HMH growth measure. 26% of our student made at least 12 points of growth, and 52% of our students made some growth this year.

Reflection: Project Outcome Analysis
Attendance continues to be a struggle which limits student literacy growth. However, in collaboration with our english department, school wide objectives, and Lmets, we were able to meet our growth goals for the year! We had an additional 6% above our goal meet the 12 points of growth or better.



Reflection: Learning and Next Steps
The HMH Reading Growth Measure is being replaced with a new literacy assessment next year. We will have to learn the new system and decide on implementation as we are trained and gain access to the program. We noticed that last year 17% of students did not take a BOY and/or EOY HMH test while this year we were missing 19% of students. We will work with teachers to test all students.
